

PLAN the sources you might use Identify possible sources - Are there sources easily available to complete my research? - Usefulness and reliability - Range of places and types - Primary/Secondary
Do I have appropriate	WHILEOT AND ASSOCIATION OF THE PROPERTY OF THE
Do I have appropriate	relevant/useful/reliable sources to complete my resource? Test the experiment - is it working No - go back to FOCUS/PLAN Yes - carry on
Do I have appropriate	No - go back to FOCUS/PLAN



Skim & Scan - **gather** relevant information and **summarise in your own words** the key information

Select evidence - relevant to Key Questions
