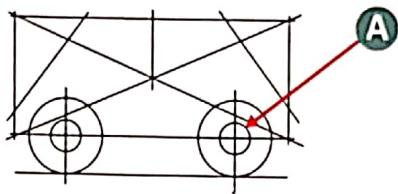


A Toy Cannon

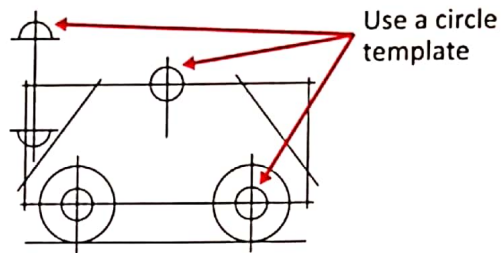
Use a circle template for the small circles and curves.

Toy Cannon Method



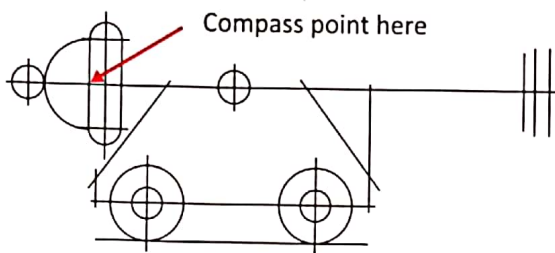
Step 1

Draw the bottom part. Start by locating the centre of, and drawing the wheel at A.



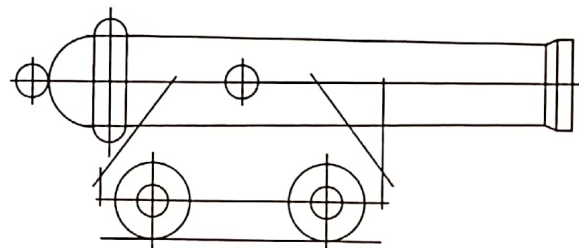
Step 2

Locate and draw the back wheel and small circles and semi-circles.



Step 3

Complete the end curves and set out for front of barrel.



Step 4

Complete the barrel. Check, erase, then outline.

Finishing Your Drawing

Use your colouring pencils and the 'layering' technique (*in this case yellow, brown and orange on top of each other*) to achieve a rustic look to the barrel of the cannon. Keep the colour away from the middle to make it look rounded.

To create the weathering effect on the barrel, use an eraser against the edge of the erasing shield to make light, vertical stripes by removing some of the colour. Be sure to keep all the stripes parallel to each other and vertical.

A 4B pencil smudged with a tissue can be used to create the rounded wheels, leaving them white in the centre.

For wood use brown, yellow and orange on top of each other. Add some curved lines on top with a sharp HB pencil to make the wood grain.

Add the shiny effect on the side with an eraser.
