3. How many changes has been made to General Electorates and Maori Electorates?	<p>AT3: 36 electorate changes</p> <p>AT4: According to the written article, “30 general and five Māori electorates have been adjusted and one new electorate has been created in south Auckland.”</p>

Using a map, identify how the Takaanini electorate has impacted on other electorates?</p>	<p>AT3: Manurewa, Papakura and Hunua OR Their land area got smaller/decreased</p> <p>AT4: According to the map, the new Takaanini electorate has impacted Manurewa, Papakura and Hunua as areas/street previously of these elecorte will now be part of Takanini - their area size decreased</p>

Why are electoral quotas used to determine the electorates?</p>	<p>AT3: Reasons relating to fair representation OR Quote to ensure roughly same population size</p> <p>AT4: Fair/Equitable (not equal) representation AND how this is ensured.</p> <p>According to the article and video, "The Representation Commission", sets the official electorate boundaries ensuring,</p> <p>"Each electorate must not exceed 5 percent or be below 5 percent of the set quota."</p> <p>This is to ensure fair representations - an electorate MP roughly representing the approx same number of the population</p>

Explain how electoral boundaries will be redrawn if an electorate is more than 5% bigger than the quota, and how a boundary will be redrawn if an electorate is more than 5% smaller than the quota?</p>	<p>AT3: According to the article and video, "The Representation Commission", sets the official electorate boundaries ensuring, "Each electorate must not exceed 5 percent or be below 5 percent of the set quota." OR 5% bigger drawn smaller OR 5% smaller drawn bigger OR Orange = area expected to shrink OR Teal = area expected to expand</p> <p>AT4: Both identified 5% bigger drawn smaller AND 5% smaller drawn bigger</p>	<p>AB5: Both described Population 5% over quota then the boundary is drawn smaller AND Population 5% over quota then the boundary is drawn smaller</p> <p>AB6: 5% bigger than the quota, electorate will be redrawn to include a smaller population 5% smaller than the quota, the electorate will be redrawn to include a smaller population</p> <p>OR</p> <p>Orange = area expected to shrink because population is 5% over quota Teal = area expected to expand as population is 5% under quota</p>

Are other factors considered</p>	<p>AT3: Yes</p> <p>AT4: Yes - boundaries that already exist OR public consultation/opinion. OR 120 seats in parliament</p>	<p>AB5: Yes - boundaries that already exist AND public consultation/opinion. AND example not directly related to the resource</p> <p>Ab6: Yes - boundaries that already exist AND public consultation/opinion. AND example attempted related to the resource</p>	<p>Be7: Yes - boundaries that already exist AND public consultation/opinion. AND example directly related to the resource</p> <p>Be8: Thoroughly completed: Answer + reason + examples of resource Yes - boundaries that already exist AND public consultation/opinion. AND At least 2x examples directly related to the resource</p> <p>Yes - boundaries that already exist, public consultation/opinion.</p> <p>For example in the article... - "a small area around Maungarei/ Mount Wellington moves into it to maintain links with Panmure following requests from the public." - Takanini public consultation</p>

Explain your viewpoint</p>	<p>AT3 - opinion identified</p> <p>AT4 - opinion described</p>	<p>Ab5 Opinion described and at least one relevant/valid justification/reason identified (from resource or own idea)</p> <p>Ab6: Opinion described and at least one solid justification/reason explanation attempted (from resource or own idea)</p>	<p>Be7: Opinion described and at least one solid justification/reason explanation or two reasons with described (from resource AND own idea)</p> <p>Be8: Opinion described and at least two solid justification/reason explained (from resource AND own idea)</p>	
<p>Judgement statement</p>	<p>Judgement includes NINE knowledge/understanding judgments - total 48</p> <p>AT = 21-31, Ab = 32-40, Be = 41-48</p>
