Why do people celebrate?

Types of Celebrations

Religious Celebrations:

The celebrations which are done to honour God such as Christmas, Easter, Eid, Diwali and Bodhi Day etc.

Traditional Celebrations

The celebrations which are passed on from one generation to another to commemorate an event, person/s or our values and beliefs. In New Zealand, Matariki is a traditional celebration. What traditional celebration do you have in your culture?

Change of Season Celebrations

In many countries people celebrate the change of seasons and harvesting of crops. Around the world, we see summer, spring, winter and autumn festivals. In India, people celebrate Baisakhi and Pongal as harvest festivals. In China, it is Moon Festival and Rice Harvest Festival in Indonesia.

Personal Celebrations

People celebrate personal achievements, landmarks and special days such as birthdays, engagements, weddings, wedding anniversary and graduation etc.

What is important for us to remember?

People have diverse traditions and celebrations and they can be different from ours. Differences in our cultures, religions and even celebrations enrich our lives. They give us new ideas. Hence it is very important that we respect all cultures.
