Underneath each of your drawings, draw two possible outcomes for your ideas by selecting from the following contexts a product or place.

Finally, explore and refine your ideas through further drawings. Your page will tell a story from top to bottom, and viewers will be able to see your thinking made visual.

## Exploration Task 2.4: Paper architecture (CL 3)

This task is about generating, exploring, refining and presenting ideas.

Use an A4 sheet of paper. Fold it, roll it, and cut it to form random shapes. Do not cut and join, as this would be construction and might lead you to make 'things', and this exercise is about generating ideas. View the rest of the class's ideas and then repeat the exercise. Choose one of your ideas as a model. Freehand draw your idea from three different viewpoints. Re-draw and add detail to your idea to create a product or place. Draw your final design on its own page, complete with a freehand-drawn border and a brief title.
