Sample - Novel

What has been the most exciting / interesting part of the novel so far? Explain what happened

P - The most interesting part of my novel so far is that the author mentioned gender stereotypes in the story, as not many books I've read have shown that.

E- In the book, there is a girl named Obayda, her father lost one of his legs in a bomb explosion that caused Obayda and her family to move cities and in the need of good fortune. Obayda's aunt had an idea to turn Obayda into a boy dressing her up as one, thinking that it would bring the family luck. Since that happened Obayda is now Obayd. Sample Expository Essay

We should ban the use of all fireworks in NZ

When a firework goes off metal salts and explosives undergo a series of chemical reactions that release smoke and gases into the air, these gases affect our planet in a dangerous manner.

A study done in 2007 by a group of researchers during the lantern festival in Beijing analysed the chemical reactions that occur during a firework display.

They found that after the fireworks erupted the levels of dangerous chemicals in the air was five times the normal amount, these chemicals included gases such as nitrogen dioxide and sulfur. A high concentration of sulfur can harm trees and plants by damaging their health and slowing down growth, SO2 and other sulfur oxides can also create acid rain which is harmful to many ecosystems.

With the rising use of fireworks, greenhouse gas levels are also rising, forcing our planet to go through climate change and global warming. It is essential that young people like you and I take action and work to protect our planet, the existence of future generations relies on how well we can look after this planet and keep it habitable.
