The assessment will be handed out to you in Term 2 Week 4. You will be given a number of practical sessions in Physical Education to demonstrate your responsible behaviours for safety and to understand them.

KEY ASSESSMENT PROCEDURES

Authenticity

All students will sign an authenticity declaration.

Missed Assessment

Situation/Setting/Context

During this term, your learning context is "Number 8 Wire". In PE and Health we are focusing on looking into Adventure tourism. We will be exploring how Risk is managed throughout New Zealand during outdoor education activities. In Physical Education, you will be partaking in different outdoor education activities in order to safely participate in a larger outdoor activity. During class time, you will have opportunities to learn about different responsible behaviours for safety that are required in outdoor education activities. You will have many opportunities to demonstrate these behaviours during practical sessions. Knowledge about these safety behaviours will be gained through classroom and practical sessions. You will be assessed on how well you demonstrate these responsible behaviours for safety and how well you can understand these responsible behaviours for safety.

Task Instructions

You will be introduced to the following responsible behaviours for safety:

- cooperation with others
- self-management
- compliance with instructions
- care of equipment
- appropriate communication
- teamwork
- assisting and supporting others
- tolerance
- conflict resolution

From the above list, you will have to demonstrate 4 of these during the practical sessions. And have a clear understanding of them.

Success criteria: You must....

- demonstrate 4 of the responsible behaviours for safety throughout practical sessions
- demonstrate these 4 responsible behaviours for safety at the appropriate time during these practical sessions
- be able to explain your understanding of these responsible behaviours for safety during outdoor education activities
