- Where did Jacinda Ardern visit last week?
 c. Antartica Ardern visited the South Pole to celebrate the 65th anniversary of Scott Base. Ardern landed in McMurdo Sound and travelled to Scott Base via Hägglund snow vehicles. During her visit the Prime Minister saw the preliminary work for the \$344 million redevelopment of Scott Base.
- Why was China's leader Xi Jinping in the news last week?

 a. He became China's first leader since Mao Zedong to get a third term in the job Xi Jinping became the first leader since Mao Zedong (the founder of the People's Republic of China), to be chosen as party chief for a third term after removing leadership term limits in 2018.
- 3. Which current world champion women's football team will be based in New Zealand for their pool matches during the FIFA World Cup?

a. USA - The World Cup will be jointly hosted by New Zealand and Australia next year. The USA team famously and successfully fought for equal pay with its male counterparts helping to increase support of the game.

- 4. What unusual item did Elon Musk, the new owner of Twitter, carry into its headquarters when visiting last week?
 c. a kitchen sink The world's richest man, Elon Musk, has completed his \$44bn takeover of Twitter, according to a filing with the US government. Mr Musk tweeted a video of himself walking into Twitter's headquarters in San Francisco carrying a sink with the caption: "let that sink in!". He also tweeted "the bird is freed" and later said "let the good times roll".
- 5. In which of the following roles do women now outnumber men?

b. Members of Parliament - For the first time, there are more women than men in New Zealand's Parliament after the newest MP was sworn in. New Labour MP Soraya Peke-Mason was sworn in last week, replacing former Speaker Trevor Mallard.

6. What is the name of Prince Harry's new book which will be coming out in January?

b. Spare - Prince Harry's memoir, is coming out January 10. The memoir's title is an apparent reference to "the heir and the spare", a phrase often used to describe royal siblings. When Harry was born, he was right behind William in the line of succession but has since been pushed down the line.

7. Why are some people who hunt and tramp in Te Urewera's backcountry, upset?

b. DOC huts in the area are being dismantled - Around 200 people gathered in Tāneatua to protest against the removal of the huts. At least 15 are gone and another 33 are set to be removed by December. Te Uru Taumatua, which is the operational entity of iwi Ngāi Tūhoe, took over the day-to-day management of Te Urewera from DOC in 2014. TUT have said the huts were worn, leaking and in need of replacement.

- Two US men are facing charges following accusations of cheating during a fishing competition. How did they cheat?
 They stuffed fish full of lead weights - Two men accused of stuffing five fish with lead weights and fish fillets during a fishing tournament on Lake Erie pleaded not guilty to cheating and other charges.
- How many COVID-19 cases were on board the Royal Caribbean when it docked in New Zealand recently?
 c. 130 - The cruise liner carries almost 5000 passengers and 1300 crew, and all guests over age 12 were required to be fully vaccinated. COVID-19 positive cases were required to isolate in their cabin for seven days.

a. 14 - Ko is also the youngest ever (age 15) to win an LPGA Tour event. In 2015 she became the youngest woman, at age 18 years, 4 months and 20 days, to win a major championship (The Evian Championship).

separatist party for federal government to sever ties with the British monarchy. The motion for Canada to sever ties with the monarchy was defeated 266-44.

c. Japan - A scheduling clash saw the All Blacks opening their

Northern Tour against Japan at 6:50pm NZT in Tokyo before the Black Ferns played their Rugby World Cup quarter-final in Whangārei.

Iran - The two travel bloggers were believed to have been held in detention in Iran since entering the country in July. Jacinda Ardern confirmed that MFAT and New Zealand Government had worked hard to ensure the safe exit of the two New Zealanders from Iran. The Government has updated travel warnings for Iran and is urging New Zealanders currently in that country to depart.
