Learning Goals:

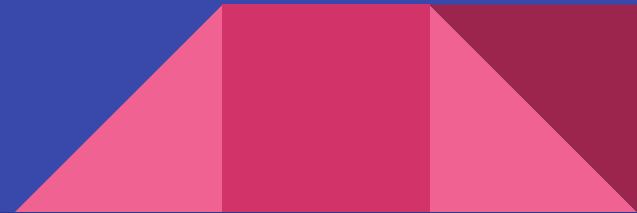
- To learn the names and stories of Māori Kaitiaki

A quick note before we begin...

It is important that we refer to these teachings as “whakapono or pakiwaitara” oppose to Māori “myths and legends”. Myths and legends implies that these stories are not true and are up for interpretation. Māori believe these stories to be true so we must honour that. Furthermore, it is not quite as simple as labelling Tangaroa, Ranginui, etc. all Gods, and “God of the sea” and “God of the sky”. It would be more correct to label them kaitiaki, or guardians of these elements.



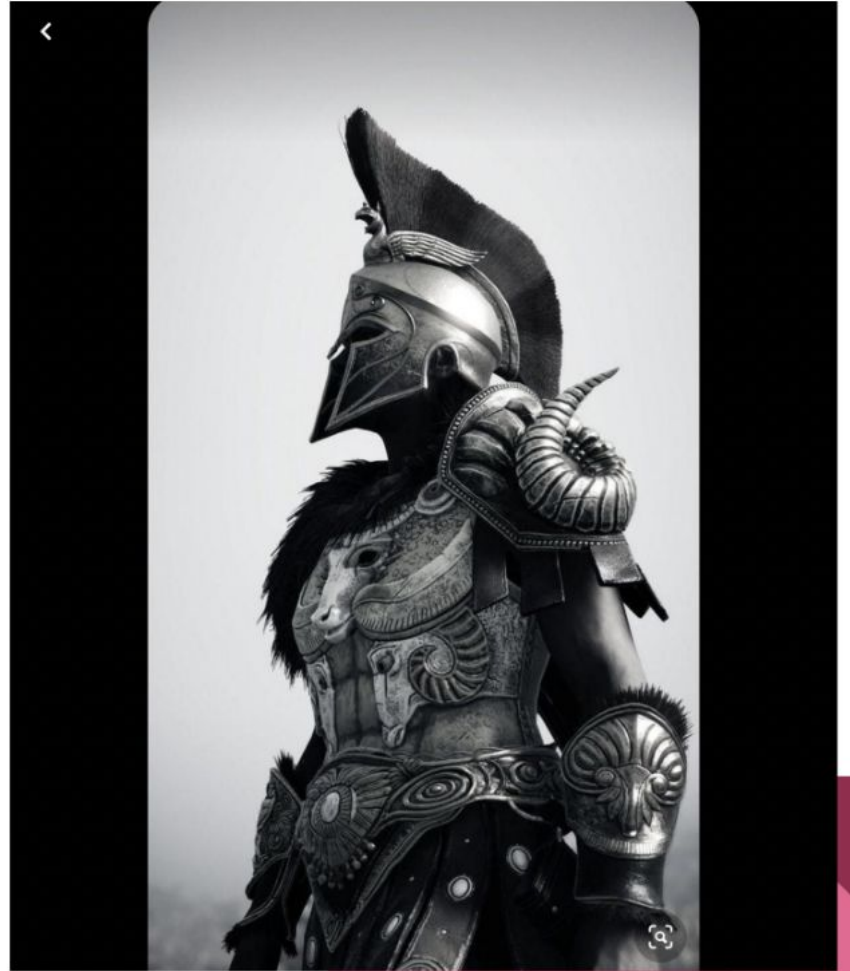
Ares (Greek)

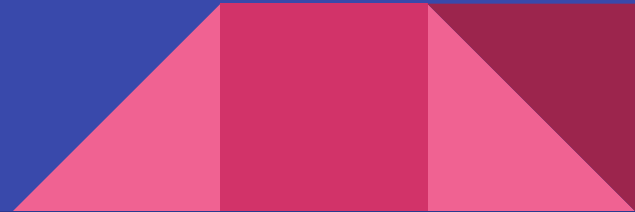

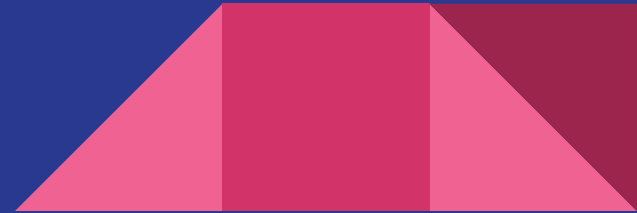
