

In this assessment I will be evaluating your ability to:

- interpret the basic static principles and design a poster for a specific target audience
- create a convincing static image through personal interpretation and explain your choices in a text
- understand the various visual features.
- understand the effect of these features.

### Step 1

Determine what images, font, color text etc you wish to use in your poster. You have researched your household water consumptions by unpacking the water bill and observing water usage patterns. In your observations you have noted length of showers (at 9 litres a minute) use of dishwashers and washing habits etc. You will create a poster that encourages us to save water. You will use the information from your research.

### Step 2

Create and design your poster for the desired audience. Use technique : layout, image, contrast and colour ,Text Lines

Explain your choices of design from layout, image, contrast and color ,text graphic or image, font or lines

### Step3 and4

Write your essay ...3 paragraphs 120 maximum using SEXY in each paragraph on either layout, image, contrast, graphic or image, font or lines or Text

Pick any 3 of these and explain WHY you used and what effect it has on the Audience

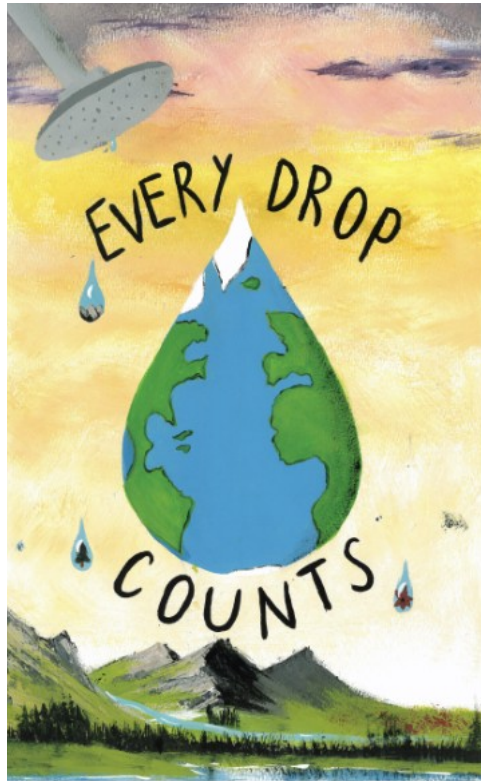
S – Sentence main statement
