- You created a design now your task is to give me your reflection on how successful you were designing your artwork. What did you research? Use **TEXAS** to write your paragraph. How did you relate to Maori and Pacifica artwork in your own creation?

Did you use the following concepts

Choice of design : Use a hand-drawn, flowing script that mimics traditional Māori carving or weaving patterns.

Incorporation of Elements: Integrate koru (spiral shapes representing new life and growth) into the strokes of the letters. You might also use **tukutuku** patterns as a background or border.

Symmetry and Balance: Maintain symmetry and balance in the design to reflect the Māori value of harmony.

Pattern Details

Koru Patterns: Integrate small koru designs into the lettering, particularly at the ends of the strokes.

Manaia Figures: Use subtle manaia (a mythical being with a bird-like head, symbolising protection) as flourishes around the text.

Tukutuku Panels: Frame the picture with tukutuku panel patterns to give it a sense of structure and grounding.

Primary Colours: Use traditional colours like red (representing mana and strength), black (representing the earth and the Māori people white (representing purity and the realm of the gods).	e), and
