

Guy Fawkes was a British soldier who is best known for his role in the Gunpowder Plot of 1605. The plot was an attempt to assassinate King James I of England by blowing up the Houses of Parliament. Fawkes was a devout Catholic who was angered by the persecution of Catholics in England. It was popularized by the 2005 film "V for Vendetta," which featured a masked vigilante who fought against an oppressive government.
