 - giving an account of personal involvement in the social justice and human rights action.

Report, in depth, on personal involvement in a social justice and human rights action involves:

- personal reasons for involvement
- an evaluation of personal involvement.

Comprehensively report on personal involvement in a social justice and human rights action involves:

- a reflection on personal involvement that includes alternative and/or additional actions
- an evaluation of the effectiveness of these alternative and/or additional actions.
- 3 *Social justice* is an outcome of social action taken to develop fair treatment and equity for all eg equal opportunity and employment laws.

Human rights are the rights that should be afforded to all people in a society to allow fair treatment and equity for all eg political rights, voting, social rights, freedom of speech, gender rights, gay marriage (civil unions).

Personal involvement means an active personal participation in an action.

A social justice and human rights action is an action which has been set up with a well-established framework and is currently operational, such as the 40 hour famine or Amnesty International letter writing.

Points of view include opinions and beliefs of individuals/groups/society(s).
